Volunteer of the Month



Our Volunteer of the Month for April is Certified Healthcare Interpreter Lynn Fors, M.A. Lynn worked for St. Joseph Hospital as coordinator of language and cultural services and became aware of SOS when it first began. In her roles at St. Joe, she worked with many immigrants and thought it was "wonderful to have such a service for people who previously had no options for surgery." She has been friends with Tony Reyes, SOS interpreter coordinator, for quite awhile and started by helping him recruit interpreters. Now, she regularly attends surgery days and is an integral part of making medical history calls and scheduling appointments for our non-English speaking patients.

Lynn is originally from Massachusetts but has lived in Kentucky since 1997. As an undergraduate student, she spent a semester in Spain that changed her life. With a degree in Medical Laboratory Technology, it was a natural fit for her to become a medical interpreter and she received training through Bridging the Gap with Catholic Charities of Louisville. She was nationally certified in 2012 and for the last three years has worked at Access Language Solutions, a nonprofit that she founded. She currently serves as ALS's executive director and leads them in offering professional interpreting and translation for previously underserved entities and populations. She also does freelance interpreting for Fayette County Public Schools and Kentucky Refugee Ministries.

Lynn has been married to Everardo (Lalo) for 12 years and they have a 16-year old son named Danny. She also has two stray cats, Max and Ruby, who showed up about 10 years ago and never left. Lynn is a big Boston Red Sox fan but does NOT want to talk about her favorite player who was recently traded to the Dodgers. A few months ago, she saw the documentary Fantastic Fungi and still can't stop thinking about it, and she religiously watches silly reality shows like 90 Day Fiancé and Married at First Sight.
